Notes to the Statement of Accounts

Basis of Accounting

The net amount chargeable to the Department of Education amounts to €165,677,415 (2009: €170,996,811) and includes € 18,200,000 (2009: €18,715,000) payable to Bus Éireann. This balance was calculated on 13% of total costs to an agreed maximum of €18,200,000.

The costs are the direct costs in respect of the Schools Transport Scheme. Direct costs for this purpose exclude amounts charged in respect of depreciation and interest on Bus Éireann - Irish Bus vehicles. In arriving at the amount chargeable for scheduled services, the factor for absenteeism has been taken into account at 4.5%.
